Alexander Hanson is recognized for his diverse conducting experience and musical craftsmanship. Hanson launched his musical career as a trumpet player, but his growing passion for conducting led him to graduate with honors from the acclaimed Sibelius Academy of Conducting in Helsinki.

Hanson works with all major Swedish orchestras and European prominent orchestras such as the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra, Tonkünstler Orchestra and Aarhus Symphony Orchestra. In 2018 he was appointed chief conductor and artistic director of The Royal Swedish Navy Band.

Hanson previously collaborated with Brussels Philharmonic for the Jazz meets Symphonic concerts featuring Brad Mehldau, Avishai Cohen, Uri Caine and Tigran Hamasyan. He conducted the Gothenburg Symphony Orchestra on Avishai Cohen's album Two Roses (2021).

BILL FRISELL TRIO, JAZZ ENSEMBLE

Bill Frisell's career as a guitarist and composer has spanned more than 40 years and many celebrated recordings, whose catalog has been cited by Downbeat as "the best recorded output of the decade". He is also a recipient of grants from United States Artists, Meet the Composer among others. In 2016, he was a beneficiary of the first FreshGrass Composition commission to preserve and support innovative grassroots music. Bill is also the subject of a documentary film by director Emma Franz, entitled 'Bill Frisell: A Portrait', which examines his creative process in depth. He has received an honorary doctorate from the Berklee College of Music.

Thomas Morgan is one of the most in-demand jazz bassists, largely due to his unique approach to his instrument, his exceptional understanding of music and his own distinctive playing style. He has played bass on over 90 recordings and toured the world as a member of bands led by Bill Frisell, Jakob Bro, Jim Black, Dan Weiss and Craig Taborn, among others.

Rudy Royston is a well-known figure in the music scene and has played with artists such as Dave Douglas, Branford Marsalis, Javon Jackson, Linda Oh, JD Allen, Dotsero, Leslie Drayton, Joe Keel and Nelson Rangell. He first played with Bill Frisell in his recording of Woman's Day.

- > Brussels Philharmonic Atelier: back to the source of symphonic music, the art of playing music in a smaller formation. We work carefully and in depth, with extra attention to delicate details.

- > Brussels Philharmonic Lab: a place where contemporary music is given the leading role, researched and tested, and exposed to other arts or forms of performance. A radical decision to experiment and focus on the future, with guest conductor llan Volkov.
- > film & festival: as a former broadcast orchestra, the Brussels Philharmonic has a deeply rooted love of film music. And we love to share our enthusiasm, knowledge and expertise with partners and festivals.

In, around and throughout the many concerts we offer, the golden thread is the theme of EXPLORE: a wide range of diverse, joined-up initiatives that invite audiences to discover. explore in greater depth, admire. share, and connect. By means of meetings, podcasts, chamber music. guided walks, educational materials and workshops, discussions after concerts, customized introductions. digital initiatives and much more. the Brussels Philharmonic comes to vou. Thanks to the vouth orchestra programme, young musicians also receive the opportunity to get down to work themselves: from an amateur level at BOENK! Brussels Young Philharmonic (BOENK!) to the preprofessional at the Youth Orchestra Flanders.

The vision of our music director, Kazushi Ono, an experienced conductor whose reputation crosses continents, cultures and genres, overlaps in so many ways with that of the orchestra: the authenticity with which the great repertoire is kept alive, the permanent quest for innovation and evolution, the commitment to giving the music of today and tomorrow a central role, and the passion for sharing the love of symphonic music widely and generously.

That sharing takes place first and foremost in our home port at Flagev. where the orchestra rehearses. performs and throws open the doors to its activities, as well as on the major stages and at festivals in Flanders. The orchestra's international reputation comes to the fore in its specialisation in recording soundtracks (including the Oscar-winning music for 'The Artist'), the many successful recordings for labels such as Deutsche Grammophon. and the ambitious projects on prestigious stages around the world (Carnegie Hall, New York, Philharmonie de Paris, Musikverein Wien, Grosses Festspielhaus Salzburg, Cadogan Hall, London).
